Time Management/Study Periods: Students are encouraged to take a full complement of courses in their timetable. However, occasionally in a Grade 11/12 student's timetable, the choice to select a study period is available. Due to the number of credits and configuration of credits required to graduate, students are allowed one study period in Grade 11 and no more than two in Grade 12. There is an opportunity to use these study periods to accomplish course work or for extra support upon arrangement with teachers or administration. Academic performance and behaviour are considerations for approval of study periods. ALL study periods must be approved by the administration. Please note that final graduation requirements are determined by the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education. The student is always responsible for ensuring that graduation requirements are met.

Dual Credit: French 30 is a potential U of R dual credit course, as the availability is approved yearly by the university. The Ministry approved these program(s) which allows high school students to take a combined high school / post-secondary, college or apprenticeship course, and earn a high school credit and a post-secondary credit.

Regina Trades & Skills Programs:

- a. **Regina Trades & Skills Centre Construction Apprenticeship Program (TASCAP):** TASCAP is a semester long, full-time program providing you with relevant training in a variety of construction trade areas as you build a residential home.
- b. Upon successful completion of one of these programs you will receive five high school credits and apprenticeship hours.
- c. Interested grade 11 or 12 students: Please see the Career Counsellor to register for the TASCAP.
