Recess Before Lunch

Based on research, the initiative of “Recess Before Lunch” is that students will “play” first and “eat” later during the traditional lunch time. This means, in our school, that following third class in the morning at 11:45 a.m., students will be dismissed for an outdoor recess break (weather permitting). At 12:10 p.m., the bell will ring to call students indoors to wash and get ready to eat their lunches.

Research indicates that this type of scheduling creates a better eating environment, that students are more settled for their first class in the afternoon, and that students tend to waste less food. Students are allowed snack in the morning before recess.

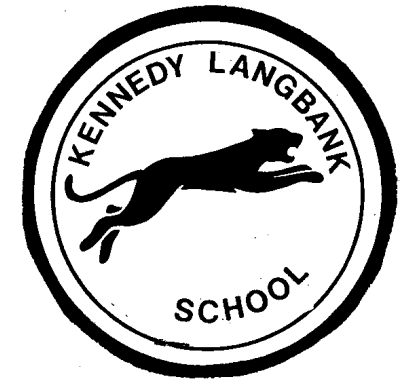
Effective Schools.....
